Responsibilities

- Exhibits and maintains Caregiver USA's mission of achieving value and happiness for oneself and others through caring for people
- Promotes a Culture of Safety by adhering to policy, procedures and plans that are in place to prevent workplace injury, violence or adverse outcome to associates and patients.
- Re-evaluates the need for continued care on an ongoing basis
- Provides oversight to STNA staff and co-signs documentation as needed in accordance with scope of practice.
- Provides skilled nursing in the home as ordered on the plan of treatment and nursing care plan.
- Evaluates the significance of assessment findings and communicates any pertinent information about the patient's clinical status and ongoing needs to others in a timely fashion.
- Ability to adequately assess and reassess pain. Utilizes appropriate pain management techniques. Educates the patient and family regarding pain management.
- Demonstrates knowledge of medications and their correct administration based on age of the patient and patient's clinical position.
- Functions as a team member demonstrating collaboration with, and responsibility to patient, physician, interdisciplinary team.
- Participates in HHA's other mandated activities, as requested by Clinical Supervisor or Patient Care Services Director including in-services and UR/PI committee.
- Perform supervisory visit to ensure care plan is performed by the caregivers.

Qualifications:

- Has an Associate's degree or equivalent in Nursing from an accredited nursing program.
- Is licensed as a License Practical Nurse in Ohio
- Excellent written and communication skills
- Effective problem solving, organizational and time management skills with the ability to consistently work in a fast-paced environment
- Must be able to work in a team environment and exhibit flexibility and strong desire to learn and develop new skills quickly
- Has at least 1 year of LPN experience, home health and hospice experience is preferred.
- Has a valid state driver's license, personal automobile insurance coverage, reliable transportation and an acceptable driving record
- Availability to work weekends.
